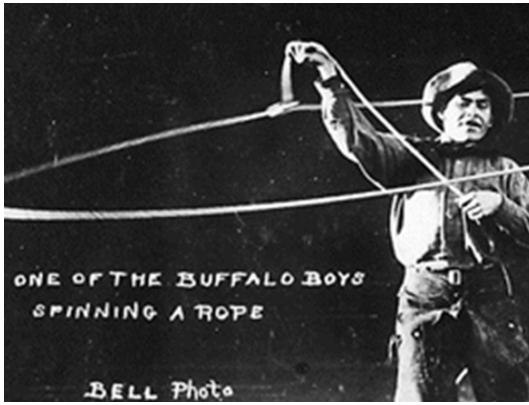

During the First World War over four thousand Aboriginal people served with the Canadian Expeditionary Force. During the first part of the war some Aboriginals who attempted to enlist were denied while others were readily welcomed. Once the government became aware of the inconsistency, and under the pressure of requiring more soldiers for fighting overseas, a decision was made (1915) to formally approve the recruitment of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit men. Mike “Miistatisomitai” Mountain Horse, the younger brother of Albert Mountain Horse, was born in 1888. At the age of six, he attended the Residential school on the Kainai Blood Tribe reserve where he lived.

The younger Mountain Horse, Mike, desiring to avenge his brother and seek honour, joined the Canadian Expeditionary Force in May 1916. Mike first enlisted in the 191st Battalion and was later transferred to the 50th Battalion.
