Adelaide Sinclair

Adelaide Helen Grant Sinclair, born on January 16, 1900, dedicated almost her entire life to public service, including service in the military during the Second World War. Sinclair grew up in the bustling city of Toronto. Early on, she defied the strict gendered expectations of women, proving to be a dedicated and intelligent leader.



HMCS Bonaventure

January 21, 1957: After a 5-year refit that began in 1952, Canada's last aircraft carrier, HMCS Bonaventure, was commissioned. "Bonnie" was originally the incomplete British carrier HMS Powerful and was one of the smallest carriers in the world capable of operating jet aircraft – so small, in fact, that apparently Americans wouldn't dare operate jets on her.

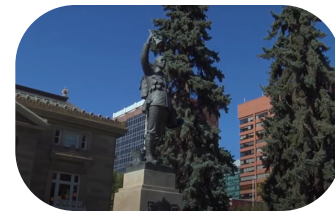
