**President's Comment**

**6<sup>th</sup> of June is D-Day Anniversary**

The **Normandy landings**, codenamed Operation *Neptune*, were the landing operations of the Allied invasion of Normandy in Operation Overlord, during World War II.

The landings commenced on Tuesday, 6 June 1944 (**D-Day**),

beginning at 6:30 am British Double Summer Time (GMT+2). In planning, as for most Allied operations, the term *D-Day* was used for the day of the actual landing, which was dependent on final approval.

There are plenty of writings about D-day but few wrote about the important role of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Canadian Division in its action to minimize the counter attacks of the Panzer Regiments, which has the decisive power to reverse the impact of Operation Overlord. The Canadian Legion magazine, May/June issue has a detailed article about the 3<sup>rd</sup> Canadian Division, in particular, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Canadian Armoured Brigade and its impact on ensuring Operation Overlord was a success.

The Normandy landing paved the way for the recovery of Europe and the rest is history.

The month of May has been a busy month for the president of EUSI/Co-Chair of the Edmonton Salutes Committee. We welcomed and hosted the Chief of the Naval Reserve during her visit to Edmonton. Then we welcomed and hosted the Chief of CAF Welfare Program. ## 2018 Symposium and President's Mess Dinner

The EUSI Symposium has been scheduled to be held on Saturday, September 2018 at the HMCS NONSUCH in Kingsway, Edmonton. The theme of the symposium is to raise discussion on Canada's defence policies against nuclear attack whether deliberate or accidental, measures to counter destruction of financial institutions, infra-structures and environmental contamination, and lessons learned. Panelists include former fighter pilot, Laurie Hawn, famed author Norman Leach, International military analyst Joe Howard, Professor Rob Hubert, Japanese Consulate to Canada and the Honorable James Bezan, Opposition Defence Critic.

Some may ask why the theme of nuclear defence policy now, with North Korea entering into agreement to stop further nuclear weapon testings. Can North Korea be trusted is one thing, there are still a few other countries that post threats. Iran and Russia for example. Hawaii was in utter confusion a few months ago following a false alarm of imminent nuclear attack, even though Hawaii has had a nuclear defence measures in place for years. Following a nuclear reactor melt down after an earthquake and tsunami in Japan, contaminated Japanese agricultural products and the sea food industry remain adversely affected. Canada needs to have a policy of counter measures to protect its property and citizens in case of a nuclear destruction.
