



With the promises of the vaccine available in the coming months, I am optimistic things will improve. I am happy to report that no one EUSI member succumbed to the Covid-19 virus. I am hoping the Next EUSI AGM will be a big splash to celebrate the return to normalcy. The annual symposium will take place in the fall as per usual. The military environment has not drastically altered despite the pandemic. Most major military powers in the world are now allocating more resources to air force and naval capabilities as the ways to engage enemies have changed significantly in the last ten years. For example, the big tank



battles saw the last action in Dessert Storm and limited action in Afghanistan. The USA Army is gradually decommissioning their tank battalions. Tank maneuver training for the British army at Camp Wainwright will be a thing of the past. Instead, we will see more activities with the air force in CFB Cold Lake. More and more declassified data have now emerged on offensive and defensive operations using drones. The Nova Scotia EUSI publish a monthly newsletter with a special report on Chinese military capabilities and their air force and navy would surpass most NATO countries within ten years, except USA, which will occur in 22 years. Ability to read Chinese allows me to maintain research and awareness on the Chinese military capabilities through various media and academic sources. My one interest is that drones on steroids is being developed that can deliver precise attacks from sea, land or in the air. As late as about ten years ago, the term Artificial Intelligence(IA) was for nerds and most do not know what that entails or even care about it. 
New Chief of Defence Staff
