

We are also confident that it will better inform our activities, optimize our impact globally and ensure the world understands the need to continue to put resources towards ending this tragedy."

Isabelle Guitard, Director of Child Soldiers International, said: "We are thrilled that our global work to prevent the military recruitment and use of children will be taken forward by the Dallaire Initiative. Like us, they believe that prevention is better than cure. They are renowned and respected advocates of children's rights in conflict, with whom we have worked closely for years in our mutual efforts to prevent the involvement of children in armed conflict. We know that our work and legacy will continue through their hard-working and passionate team."

The Dallaire Initiative is taking over the DRC and South Sudan community led prevention and reintegration programs. "With the (low-frequency active sonar) transmitter and receiver combined in line in a single towed array, the requirement for a second independent tow for the transmitter is eliminated, so allowing the single reelable array to be installed on the Halifax-class ships with only minimal modification."

Having a low-frequency active sonar transmitter and receiver combined in each ship's 'tail' will make the Royal Canadian Navy's Halifax-class frigates potent anti-submarine warships. The ships may be busy these days doing drug interdiction off Africa and alliance diplomacy in the Mediterranean but ultimately they need to be ready for major conflict. Anti-submarine operations, theatre and local/convoy, were a forte of the RCN in years past, and is a reasonable fit for the Navy now and in the future as Canada's contribution to alliances and coalitions. Great to read of the low-frequency active sonar capability moving from research and development to fleet deployment.

"A guided projectile, HVP can drop high explosives on enemies on the ground up to three times as far as conventional ship gun ammo with a high rate of precision."

The ability to fire a hyper velocity projectile HVP from a 5" naval gun will add considerable potency to warships mounting that size gun. The Royal Navy Type 26 frigate, upon which design the Canadian Surface Combatant (CSC) will be based, will carry the 5" 62-calibre Mark 45 naval gun system, in use with several NATO navies. Assuming the CSC carries the same gun, and as it is understood the requirements for the ship specifies a large gun there is no reason to assume otherwise, that means the CSC will be capable of firing HVP. The CSC will thereby have a good land-attack capability besides an effective gun for anti-surface ship and air defence. Indeed, having such a gun blurs the line between the CSC being typed as a frigate and as a destroyer.

The 5" gun of the Iroquois-class destroyers was not great for anti-air, according to one ship's commanding officer, much due to its ammunition (slow rate of fire was another factor). (Of course, the Iroquois-class had a surface-to-air missile system to make up for that.) Ammunition has to be considered as part of a warship system. If naval staff can include HVP with the CSC's gun, either as part

of the project to acquire the ships or thereafter once the HVP has been proven, then Canada and the Royal Canadian Navy will have procured an even more capable warship.

We have raised concerns in this forum before with regard to Canada missing opportunities to work with our allies on cyber-security with the last one being our failure to join the NATO-accredited Cooperative Cyber Defence Center of Excellence in Estonia. Canada is apparently continuing this trend and was absent from a US-Taiwan network security workshop run by their Global Cooperation Training Framework. The workshop covered cyber-security, new technology and the upcoming 5G rollout. Many Pacific nations attended including Japan, Australia, Chile and Mexico with additional participation from the EU. One has to suspect Canada's insistence on an overly rigorous application of the "one-China" policy was the cause for our failure to attend. Significantly all those nations attending have some form of "one-China" policy but are still able to exercise the needed flexibility.

On the 5G and Huawei controversy one rarely hears from the service providers. This is changing and the views are often opposed.

Normally when one hears from industry the argument is that a Huawei ban will inevitably raise consumer costs and that security concerns are overblown. However, Rogers' vice- chairman supports a 5G ban for Huawei believing it will be controlled by the Chinese government. Unlike other communications providers, Rogers also expects no additional costs from such a ban because it has partnered with Ericsson for its 5 G work. Other providers, such as Telus, do use Huawei and oppose its banning, suggesting costs, not security, are the dominant consideration.



Canadian-Chinese relations have continued to deteriorate since the Meng Wanzhou extradition arrest. Canadian Canola shipments are restricted and the same may be occurring with our pork exports to China. A Canadian drug trafficker has had his sentence increased to the ultimate penalty. Most importantly, Mr. Kovrig and Mr. Spavor remain in Chinese detention. Up to this point it is probably safe to say Canada was relying on the US to advance the latter's case as it negotiated the US-Chinese trade agreement. Now that that agreement is in peril, one suspects that Canada's possibly best chance of getting Kovrig and Spavor back has diminished dramatically. In fact, recent comments by the Prime Minister, Foreign Minister, and Defence Minister have taken a harsher tone with regard to China covering everything from Tiananmen Square to the Chinese imprisonment of the Uighurs. The Prime Minister also made clear that we were reaching out to our allies and Australia, Denmark, Estonia, France, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Spain, the United Kingdom, the United States, the EU, the G7 and NATO have given us support. Barring a major escalation with China that could involve Canadian-applied sanctions, the expelling of Chinese diplomats and spies, and taking our trade concerns to the World Trade Organization, this international outreach to our allies has probably been our best option. That it is likely effective can be judged by China's outrage over our doing so. So now we come to the Nova Scotian response.


Drones are a cheap and easy way to obtain an air force, albeit simple, for a group that might not otherwise be able to do so.

Canadian forces deployed to other countries, no matter how seemingly underdeveloped, must be prepared to operate in an environment where the other side(s) has aerial capabilities.







- -The language does not include ways and means to identify and deal with Agents of Foreign Influence.
- -The language does not include ways and means to identify and deal with adversarial online domains.
- -The language does not include enabling a relationship with the national Strategic Communications community, to identify and counter new and developing players and techniques meant to influence elections and sow chaos and adversity in pre-existing social and cultural rifts?
- -The language does not highlight a need to identify experts, both foreign and domestic, who already do this, to share lessons learned, tactics, techniques, and procedures.
- -The language does not identify a need for studies to identify the best solutions to counter adversarial online attempts, not just on social media.
- -We need to identify common sense cyber solutions, as well.
- -This effort should be run by non-profit efforts, not big-profit corporations.


