

The US House Armed Services Committee "approved a requirement for the Navy to study the prospect of buying a version of the Coast Guard's Fast Response Cutter..."

"The idea is for the Navy to consider basing these smaller patrol vessels in Bahrain where they would operate in the littoral waters of the Persian Gulf."

There are good reasons why a navy procures a range of vessels from high-capability ('high end') combatants such as cruisers and destroyers to (usually smaller, slower and lightly armed) low-capability ('low end') patrol vessels and coastal combatants. That is what being a balanced navy is about. A balanced navy is more efficient - cost and employment effective. Details of the balance depend on the national geo-strategic situation and resulting requirements. The Royal Canadian Navy is somewhat in a balanced position: frigates at the high end, large patrol vessels (Harry DeWolf-class Arctic and Offshore Patrol Vessels) in the middle, and small patrol vessels (Kingston-class mine warfare vessels) at the low end. Putting aside requirements for logistics vessels, drones and submarines, some high-end destroyers (or frigates approaching destroyer capability) are needed but otherwise Canada seems to be well off. What is important is to keep shipbuilding ongoing to keep it that way.

Why America Needs a New Way of War

30 years of focus on regional wars have left the US military vulnerable to major powers acting on a global scale who purposely erode international confidence in the US but avoid direct engagement of US forces. The author offers no solution, stating his purpose is to define the problem, but suggests the 2018 National Defence Strategy (NDS 2018) is on the right track by identifying China and Russia as America's principal adversaries, and by applying power instruments other than military force (e.g., trade interruption) to achieve corrective action.

Critics disagree, suggesting NDS 2018 is based on fears of global conspiracy against the US, incites paranoia, and risks invoking a Cold War that will disproportionately harm US (and Allied) interests. 
Royal Air Force 'wings' Brevets in Second World War Propaganda

CJOC Highlights May 2019 (<u>https://www.canada.ca/en/department-national-</u> <u>defence/services/operations/military-operations/current-operations/update.html</u>):

- In April and May 2019, the CAF assisted Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick with flood relief efforts following requests for assistance from provincial authorities on **Operation LENTUS**. In May 2019, the CAF began assisting Ontario with the evacuation of the community of Pikangikum First Nation following a requests for assistance from provincial authorities. At the request of the province of Alberta, Canadian Armed Forces is coordinating with provincial authorities and getting ready to launch Operation LENTUS in support of the fight against wildfires in Northern Alberta.
- On May 1, 2019, Brigadier-General (BGen) Michel-Henri St-Louis assumed command of **Joint Task Force-IMPACT** from BGen Colin Keiver at Camp Canada in Kuwait.
- On May 6, 2019, two Albanian soldiers died in the line of duty from injuries sustained during an Explosive Ordnance Disposal task with NATO's enhanced Forward Presence Battle Group Latvia. Other Albanian soldiers were also injured during the incident. Canada extends our deepest condolences to our Albanian NATO allies and the families of Sergeant Zarife Hasanaj and Major Klodjan Tanushi
- From May 27 to June 7, 2019, soldiers, sailors, aviators, and Canadian Rangers deployed to Whitehorse, Yukon to begin participating in a whole-of-government emergency response exercise, known as **Operation NANOOK TATIGIIT 2019**.
- On May 30, 2019, **Exercise TRADEWINDS 2019** began in Latin America and the Caribbean. TRADEWINDS is a U.S. Southern Command-led exercise. The exercise is taking place until June 21, 2019.
- On May 30 2019, HCMS Regina and its embarked CH-148 Cyclone helicopter concluded their

deployment on **Operation ARTEMIS**. Naval Replenishment Unit Asterix participated into Op ARTEMIS deployment.

• In June 2019, the Canadian Armed Forces are deploying ships and a maritime patrol aircraft, under **Operation NEON**, to ensure sanctions are imposed against North Korea.

Headquarters News

USAF Buried in Canada

The article "Adventurer dedicating plaque to historic Cold War jet crash" (<u>https://www.tbnewswatch.com/local-news/adventurer-dedicating-plaque-to-historic-us-jet-crash-5-photos-1473452</u>) led to a query to Veterans Affairs Canada, who manage the Canadian Military Memorials Database (CMMD)



(https://www.veterans.gc.ca/eng/remembrance/memorials/national-inventory-canadian-memorials). The CMMD is a repository of monuments and memorials located in communities across Canada, with currently more than 7,500 memorials posted on the website. VAC confirmed that memorials such as the plaque mentioned in the article do not qualify for the CMMD as the database is of Canadians only. It is not known whether there is any listing of memorials to USAF and other foreigners in Canada. RUSI(NS) has written on a related topic, "Remembering Merchant Mariners" (https://rusi-ns.ca/remembering-merchant-mariners/) - Deadman's Island in Halifax is considered a memorial to all USN and Merchant Marine buried in Canada.
