

Canada has not even yet built new Joint Support Ship (JSS) replenishment oilers based on the German Type 702 Berlin-class, and here are the Germans approving acquisition of Type 707 for entry into service 2024.

What people should bear in mind in considering this story is the long lead time for ship procurement, especially in the current Canadian system. Canada is building now, for launch in a couple years, ships that were approved many years ago. Still, this announcement may add further fuel to public (or, at least, pundit) criticism of the JSS procurement.

And the ships are oilers, not tankers. Tankers are civil ship that transport large loads of fuel usually from one port to another.

The Transport Canada Vessel Registration Query System lists 23 tankers over 10,000 gross tonnes.

Okay, the objective per the article is to reduce ship strikes on whales (and concomitant injury to boaters and others afloat), which is certainly a public concern at this time in the Canadian Atlantic provinces, and the technology is geared accordingly. How does such civil-military environmental crossover collaboration get initiated, funded and progressed?

Infographic: Five Common Myths about Huawei and 5G

This infographic labels as a myth the often-repeated Huawei claim that it does not spy on behalf of the Chinese government. Despite a quite clear 2017 Chinese law that requires that firm to do just that, Huawei has consistently claimed it does not and follows the rule of law in those countries where it operates. This claim is exceedingly doubtful. It is a matter of public record that Huawei (with ZTE) installed the computers and network in the African Union headquarters in Addis Ababa built as a "gift" of the Chinese government in 2012 (https://www.ft.com/content/c26a9214-04f2-11e8-9650-9c0ad2d7c5b5). However, every night the contents of every computer in the building were surreptitiously sent to China. Backdoors were also found in the Huawei equipment in Vodaphone's networks in Italy in 2009 (https://www.bloomberg.com/opinion/articles/2019-04-30/huawei-backdoors-found-by-vodafone-are-a-smoking-gun). This January two Huawei employees were arrested for spying in Poland (https://www.theguardian.com/technology/2019/jan/11/huawei-employee-arrested-in-poland-over-chinese-spy-allegations).

This week the Czech media reported on an extensive data collection effort against Czech citizens. Former managers of Huawei reported they were directed to collect all manner of private data on individuals, and especially data on higher government officials. That data would then be sent back to China and also shared with Chinese embassy officials in Prague. There appeared to be no obvious link between those targeted and Huawei's commercial dealings.

Canada set to postpone Huawei 5G decision to after the election – sources

The CBC reports that the government will delay a decision on Huawei participation in Canada's future of 5G networks until after the election due to the tensions in the Canadian-Chinese relationship. The report also admitted there was little the Liberal party would gain from voters if it announced its decision before the election. The CBC's sources also suggested the government did not wish to make its decision until the fate of the two detained Canadians in China was clearer. These considerations did not affect the Conservative party's position which is that Huawei should be banned outright from future Canadian 5G networks.

July polling indicates strong support for the Conservative position with 68% of Canadians calling for an outright ban on Huawei and with only 17% in support of that firm. If one returns to the recent Liberal government decision to postpone a decision on Huawei until after the fall election, it would not be untoward to imagine another Liberal government motive for postponing would be to avoid voter anger should it permit Huawei into future Canadian 5G networks. Given the wildly pro-China commentary of some recent members of the Liberal elite, like Jean Chrétien and John McCallum, that outcome could well have been a strong possibility.

The British government's position on Huawei appears to be developing and now appears more coherent than that of the Canadian government. Earlier, it indicated a willingness to allow Huawei into parts of a future British 5G system. That, however, is now in doubt as the government indicated recent US initiatives to deny the firm access to US computer products makes a future Huawei 5G system potentially unreliable. Despite earlier indications, the UK government now states it has not reached a decision on Huawei and 5G. With the United States, Australia and New Zealand outright banning Huawei, this leaves Canada and the UK as undecided. This type of division amongst the "Five-Eyes" community over a significant security issue is immensely problematic as it will affect information sharing - the key function of the group.



FLAG OF INCONVENIENCE

AS tensions between Britain and Iran escalate over Iran's tit-for-tat seizure of an oil tanker in the Strait of Hormuz, what is the lineage of the "British" ship at the centre of the row, the Stena Impero?

The ship is a chemical and oil products tanker, built in Guangzhou in south-west China and launched at a traditional Chinese ceremony in January 2018. She was the last in a series of 13 ships ordered by her owner, Stena Bulk, which itself is based in Gothenberg and part of one of the largest family-owned companies in Sweden. Stena also has offices in Copenhagen, Singapore, Houston and Dubai.

Stena uses Northern Marine, a Clydebankbased fleet management and crewing company, to manage the ship, which has a crew of 23 seafarers who are from India, Russia, Latvia and the Philippines. However, Stena chose to register the Impero under the British flag – hence, flying the Red Ensign, she is seen as a British responsibility.

The last *Eye* noted that Brexit has led to a dramatic fall in the number of ships registering under the British flag. To combat this decline, the UK shipping register has changed its rulebook and declared itself an international register. This means Commonwealth countries, plus another 20 nations including China, Panama and the Marshall Islands, can now choose to register under the British flag.

Could the Royal Navy soon find itself rushing to protect a Chinese or Panama-owned ship? Murky waters indeed...


