This report outlines how in-country Huawei employees assisted the Ugandan government in spying on the political opposition and the Zambian government on its dissidents. In the former case, Huawei helped the police break into the encrypted communications of its opposition party and, in the latter, assisted the police in shutting down opposition news sites. The report could not establish direct links to the Chinese government or Huawei's Chinese executives. However, it is also clear Huawei's claims of never being involved in spying are as doubtful as ever. A good article. Considering the article's comments on ice capability, yes, the Arctic and Offshore Patrol Ship (the Navy will start using 'Arctic and Offshore Patrol Vessel' - AOPV - once the first ship accepted) is often described as 'ice-capable.' The Department of National Defence (DND) and the Navy



have avoided calling the ships icebreakers (icebreaking is a Canadian Coast Guard program). Good to read in the article an explanation of acceptance trials.

DND staff have emphasized that ships are patrol vessels (combatants, yes, but minor combatants). Force projection (that is more of an operational than tactical term) is inherent in the ability of the ships to call in other resources (fighter aircraft, frigates).

Shipbuilders such as Irving more often use the term 'delivery' whilst the DND and Navy often use the traditional marine term 'acceptance.' Two sides of the same coin.







NNF will become part of CFB Halifax, though apparently as DND property it comes under a different RP Ops of the I&E Group than the rest of the base. Interesting that it is called a 'facility' – previously DND property was known either as base, station or site. Of course, what with garrisons, camps, wings, etc., standardization of terminology has taken a hit.
