For Xi Jinping, the biggest danger to the Communist Party is itself

The article "For Xi Jinping, the biggest danger to the Communist Party is itself", written by Wang Xiangwei on 12 October 2019, makes an interesting read and worthy of thought. As Xi has gained further power by closing down avenues for participation by members of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) by way of his self-serving "corruption campaign" to eliminate rivals, he also has caused the party to atrophy, which has far reaching effects.

At 70, the CCP sees itself at a critical phase where although party membership is high, its action or inaction could cause a rapid demise of the system as happened in the former USSR at age 69. The Party itself is part of the problem...but so is Xi and his overall incompetence in dealing with virtually all facets of Chinese growth. There will be a party plenum sometime this month. Dates have not been announced. Quite surprisingly though, some major changes are usually the outcome, such as Deng's move to a semi-market economy in the late 1980s.

China is beset with major problems. It is in low-level conflict with all its neighbours, it is in a major trade war with the US, its economy is slowing, over 40% of the population is still in poverty, it has a massive real estate bubble, its lack of rule of law that protect outside investment continues to hamper growth, and not to mention its handling of Hong Kong and Taiwan. China is in fact a mess with little hope of achieving its longer term goals as more countries view Chinese actions as self-serving.

This author suggests that real "rule of law" should be the next step, something that is unlikely to happen in real terms. This month will likely see a "solution" of sorts for Hong Kong, some move on trade talks with the US and an outcome for the Party Plenum that will be worth studying. Certainly, there will be issues of consequence in the near future.

Tsai pledges to defend Taiwan, calls Beijing's 'one country, two systems' a failure

This week marks the 108th anniversary of the founding of the Republic of China (ROC) on 10 October 2019 or "10-10 day." President Tsai of Taiwan (ROC) gave a ten-minute speech in which she stated that Taiwan would defend itself but would not provoke China. She clearly however, expressed the view that China's actions in Hong Kong proves that the one country, two systems is an abject failure. In her speech she also comments on Hong Kong; it is now into the fifth month of demonstrations and the economy and tourism have suffered to the point that Asian press sources wonder whether Hong Kong will ever recover its place as an international business centre. China's actions have consisted mainly of threats and ham-fisted actions in Hong Kong. There is little doubt that President Xi's ongoing program of increasing control is forcing an overall decent into reactionary times in China overall. Any action

against Hong Kong will result in international actions against China potentially closing China's access to international investment opportunities. Given China's increasing debt load coupled with the massive bubble in Chinese real estate a misstep would cause a major problem in the Chinese economy as international investment would likely dry up.

The Canadian Government elected on 21 Oct 19 must look at its relationship with China and Taiwan in a new light especially given China's actions against Canadian citizens in China. Keep in mind as well, that there are over 300,000 Canadian citizens in Hong Kong, most with dual citizenship. China does not respect dual citizenship and therefore there are potentially tens of thousands of Canadians at risk. Does Canada have a plan to evacuate Canadian citizens? China is a totalitarian regime and Taiwan is a liberal democracy; it is something worth considering whom we have more in common. Does any Canadian Government want to be seen to embolden a totalitarian regime by offering up a liberal democracy? Can we say Czechoslovakia in 1938? I sincerely hope that any future Canadian Government will act in an ethical and moral way even if it hurts economically. China under the Chinese Communist Party is not a friend.
