

Although the official start of fabrication began in May 2018, authenticating the ship's keel symbolically recognizes the joining of modular components and represents the ceremonial beginning of the ship."

There are differences in tradition and ceremony between navies, even those that have common links in history. The US Navy authenticates keels of ships. For a Royal Canadian Navy ship, the keel is 'laid,' usually with a coin placed or welded to the keel (or block representing the keel).

- LOCUST (Low-Cost UAV Swarming Technology) drones

- Submarine Hold-At-Risk, (SHARK), part of Distributed Agile Submarine Hunting (DASH)

- Netted Emulation of Multi-Element Signature against Integrated Sensors (NEMESIS) which employs distributed systems including decoys, jammers, acoustic countermeasures, and multiple-input/output radios (MIMO) to create dozens of fake sensor returns.

Report slams Norwegian Navy for training, safety shortfalls in the run-up to frigate sinking

The Accident Investigation Board of Norway (AIBN) has released "Part 1" of its report on the collision of Norwegian frigate HELGE INGSTAD with oil tanker SOLA TS on 8 November 2018. Although blame was found with multiple parties, considerable emphasis was placed on the inexperience of naval bridge watchkeepers, their failure to appreciate the unfolding situation, and their subsequent decision-making. AIBN's composite video of the incident, constructed with animation graphics and embedded actual audio/video recordings, suggests a much more serious event was only narrowly avoided.

- a. changes to navy watchkeeper training,
- b. mandated warship use of AIS in VTS-controlled areas, and
- c. mandatory warship use of voyage data recorders.

No mention is made of the alleged ship design flaws that the Norwegian previously stated had contributed to the damage sustained by the frigate, and which was strenuously denied by the builder. Several comments in the report echo similar findings in US Navy investigations of their recent incidents in the Pacific: junior officer inexperience, inadequate training, confirmation bias, poor decision-making.

Fortunately, only minor injuries were reported, despite mass evacuation [https://vimeo.com/299606100] of HELGE INGSTAD. The frigate was refloated [https://youtu.be/9oGwA2vmA-I] after divers removed its missile canisters [https://youtu.be/bQSe6X7GIkw] and torpedoes [https://youtu.be/rqVR2AK9DW4] but Norway decided to scrap the frigate after determining repair costs would exceed the \$1.2 billion replacement price.

The AIBN investigation continues.

Irving Shipbuilding has stated that "we want to get this right before we turn the ship over to the Navy."

It is 'normal' that the first ship of a class, especially a new class, is late. This is because shipyards do not build prototypes (often multiple versions) the way that aircraft manufactures do. The first Halifaxclass frigate was very late as well. 'Success' is measured by the arrival date of the last ship in the class and the overall cost of the program. HMCS ST. LAURENT was such a terrible ship that she spent inordinately long periods in everything from short work periods to major refits and was never a reliable ship despite the cost and effort by the navy. The admirals were quite glad to pay her off and be done with her.

Irving want to avoid that happening and is prepared to face the additional costs and criticisms in the media in order to take the corrective actions now rather than later.

Another Way to Buy Frigates

Despite sharing numerous common legacy and security factors (with some obvious geopolitical differences), Australia and Canada employed markedly different requirement definition and procurement processes for their frigate replacement projects. Although Canada incurred significant delay and cost, the same selection was ultimately made: BAE Type 26 (with some notable CANAVMOD - Canadian Naval Modifications).


Ian Mack, who claims intimate involvement with the Canadian project from 2007 to 2017, offers a comparison of the processes that is not flattering to Canada with his analysis "Another Way to Buy Frigates" (https://www.cgai.ca/another way to buy frigates).

"In Canada, significant effort was expended on regular reporting to layers of senior governance throughout the RfP [Request for Proposal] development phase, predominantly on project status and changes. Despite the onerous reporting demands, only a few key decisions were rendered and rarely in a timely manner. The opposite was the case in Australia."

"Also in the mandatory category in CSC [Canadian Surface Combatant] were such things as intellectual property, liabilities and insurance requirements – such terms being debated at great length before finalization (in the case of intellectual property with final decisions only in the last hours before RfP release). Australia employed the more pragmatic approach of defining desires without mandatory minimums"

"And while litigation was always a possibility for both projects, there was more of a preoccupation in Canada around the pursuit of zero risk by achieving fairness and certainty as absolutes. Australia's RfT [Request for Tender] appeared to be based on the recognition that, in selected existing military off-the-shelf ship designs, which rendered the competition to be more about assessing apples, oranges and bananas, a more pragmatic RfT approach was needed."





