

It appears that ship delivery/acceptance is one commonality between Royal Canadian Navy and US Navy practices for ship building/procurement. There are other significant items, activities and dates (not going to write 'milestones' when writing about water-going vessels) and related terms that differ. Care has to be taken by writers (especially media) and readers to use Canadian terms what with how our consciousness and understanding is inundated with American media and information.

Delivery/transfer of the future HMCS HARRY DEWOLF, first of the Harry DeWolf-class Arctic and Offshore Patrol Vessels (AOPV) being built under the Arctic and Offshore Patrol Ship (AOPS) project for Canada and the Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) can be anticipated in the next few months (no later than end spring 2020?).

How Cozy Is Russia and China's Military Relationship?

The Moscow Times article "How Cozy is Russia and China's Military Relationship?" by Dmitry Trenin on 20 November 2019 gives a good overview both of the benefits and concerns regarding the Russia-China partnership.

In the article Mr Trenin focuses on the new initiative by the partnership to improve China's overall early warning system. He carefully notes this is not a sale of new equipment but rather is Russian expertise to strengthen China's ability to counter-act any potential long-range attack on its facilities. He also theorizes that China may adopt a "launch on warning" of an impending missile attack. This has overall "stabilizing effect, according to Mr Trenin. The article mainly sees the United States as the real threat.

The problem that China has is that its continuing relationship with Pakistan has also increased the very real possibility of a potential Indian attack, if provoked. The Western press has been very remiss in reporting various threats between Pakistan and India, with Pakistan within the past month renouncing the concept of no first use. Given the state of relations in regard to the Kashmir this is probably the most problematic nuclear competition on the planet. The question for China is: is the US really the most likely attacker? The answer is probably no and that the amount of time they would have would be mere seconds from a much closer threat with a triad (bomber, ground based missile and submarine launched systems) of nuclear capabilities.

The author also recognizes that Russia and China have not really formed any real partnership and that Russia still maintains some strategic ambivalence in its relationship as does China. This is not a permanent solution by any means. China can and will reverse engineer any Russian equipment and will only buy sufficient equipment in order for this to happen. By handing over technology and knowledge, Russia risks becoming a mere handmaiden to China. It is a deal that would make the Czars roll over in their graves. China is a competitor not an ally in historical terms.



Mathew Fisher, well known and long time serving Canadian journalist, will be in Halifax early next week as part of HISF and is looking to speak and engage with interested members of the community on defence and security issues. His bio is below. Canadian journalist Matthew Fisher spent 35 years as a foreign correspondent for the National Post, the Globe and Mail and other Canadian news organizations with a particular interest in security and military issues, politics and sports. He has lived in Russia, Germany, Belgium, Britain, Hong Kong, the Middle East and Afghanistan and has covered eight Olympic Games. His assignments have taken him to 175 countries and every major Canadian foreign military deployment over the past 40 years. He has been to all US states, Canadian provinces and territories and has traveled extensively in the High Arctic in Russia, Greenland, Alaska and Canada. Fisher has been an eyewitness to 20 wars and conflicts in Central America, eastern Europe, Africa, the Middle East and Asia. He has been to war with British, American and Australian forces in Afghanistan and Iraq and was one of the few foreign eyewitnesses to the Rwandan genocide and the horrors that Major General Roméo Dallaire and his small Canadian team experienced there. Earlier this year he was onboard HMCS Regina when she was tailed by Chinese warships and fighter jets. He speaks English, French, German and some Russian and Spanish. The personal highlights of Fisher's career as a foreign correspondent were Nelson Mandela's inauguration in Pretoria and being at the Iraqi front lines with US Marines during the overthrow of Saddam Hussein. He has won many awards for his war coverage. In 2012 he was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012 for his contribution to public understanding of security and defence issues. Fisher has written books on alpine ski racing and the failure of the Alberta-based Principal Group financial empire.
