"French FREMM (Frégate européenne multi-mission) NORMANDIE is in the midst of its post-delivery shakedown cruise before joining active service with the French Navy." The term 'shakedown' can be official or not. The term is not in use (yet) for the Arctic and Offshore Patrol Ship (AOPS) project ships, but it is a useful term. 'Pre-acceptance' and 'post-acceptance' trials seems to be the preferred official terms for AOPS.

"Though the ships are all from NATO member countries, they are not operating under the alliance construct..." No need, and many precedents, for operating on a non-NATO basis. All the nations have bi-lateral arrangements with the US. At times it is useful not to be under the NATO construct, its command arrangements and concomitant rules of engagement and the like.

Interesting to read the statement "U.S. 2nd Fleet's mission to ensure security and stability in the North Atlantic and the Arctic" emphasizing the Fleet's focus on the Arctic.

Note that the article used the Canadian form of writing type and pennant numbers (FFH 332) and not the American convention (DDG-51, with a hyphen). It also used the European form (D651) which highlights that despite being typed as a frigate, FS (French Ship) NORMANDIE carries a destroyer designator.



This article by the Bloomberg editorial staff dated 15 January 2020 should give the Canadian government pause for thought.

According to the Financial Post, Rogers announced that it had a 5G network in place with Ericson 5G equipment (https://business.financialpost.com/technology/rogers-officially-activates-canadas-first-5g-network-but-customers-cant-use-it-yet). Bell and Telus are opting for Huawei equipment and in Bell's case spent more than a billion dollars already in 5G development including Huawei material. Bell and Telus both knew that Huawei was being looked at as a security risk, and knew the issues some countries including the Czech Republic have had with it. RUSI(NS) has written about these issues as well. One cannot be too sympathetic to companies willing to ignore our nation's security for profit.

Canada has been warned by the US that use of Huawei equipment in Canada's 5G networks will result in the loss of opening into the Five Eyes intelligence network. Aside from President Trump, the US Department of Justice is pursuing Meng Wanzhou for fraud, and now Secretary Mnuchin has stated that Huawei is not a chess piece. Canada stands to lose a lot if we are excluded from the Five Eyes network. China under its present leadership is not a friend, and Canadian governments, academics and businesses now and in the future must understand that point. No Chinese company can be allowed to build or modify critical infrastructure until the Chinese Communist Party is relegated to history.

Seaspan to Lay Keel for Royal Canadian Navy's First Joint Support Ship, Future HMCS Protecteur

The Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) has not yet homologated the type designation and pennant numbers for the vessels being built under the Joint Support Ship (JSS - sic, singular) project. The writer of the article is correct in writing AOR (Auxiliary Oiler, Replenishment) as that is the type designation of the Berlin-class whose design is the basis for the JSS (see: "Auxiliary Oiler Replenishment" https://rusi-ns.ca/auxiliary-oiler-replenishment/). The pennant (a.k.a. hull) numbers 509 and 510 as written in the article were those of the preceding PROTECTEUR

and PRESERVER and would not be used for the JSS. Likely the numbers for two new ships will be 511 and 512, as the RCN has tended to number auxiliaries sequentially (unlike destroyers and frigates which tend to be in blocks, e.g., Halifax-class frigates FFH 330 to 341).






