COVID-19

The Canadian Armed Forces and COVID-19 -- May 22 update

Colleagues and partners in defence,

Writing to you this week is especially difficult. For the second time in as many weeks, the Defence Team is grieving. On Sunday, we tragically lost Captain Jenn Casey, a public affairs officer with the Royal Canadian Air Force Snowbirds team. Every life lost is painful, but the fact that Captain Casey lost hers as the Snowbirds were trying to lift the spirits of Canadians during the pandemic makes it all the more heart wrenching. Over the past few weeks, the Snowbirds have excited communities, boosting morale across the country through Op INSPIRATION.

Our thoughts are with everyone in mourning – Jenn's family and friends, the Snowbirds, the Royal Canadian Air Force, DND/CAF Public Affairs branch, and the entire defence community. We also

wish a full and speedy recovery to Captain Richard MacDougall, who is recovering from his injuries. And we thank the first responders and the community of Kamloops for their fast action and efforts to come to the aid of both of our members immediately following the crash. Operation INSPIRATION has been postponed until further notice, the Snowbird fleet is on an operational pause and a flight safety investigation is underway. As with any accident, we won't get answers right away, but a thorough process is necessary to maintain the integrity of the investigation.

I believe the best way to honour Jenn's legacy is by doing what she did best - enthusiastically telling the story of the bravery of our Canadian Armed Forces. Throughout this entire pandemic, our message has been constant – DND and the CAF are here to support Canadians in *any way* and *anywhere* that we can.

We continue to support long-term-care facilities. Currently, the CAF is supporting a total of 30 long-term-care facilities in Ontario and Quebec, working alongside civilian health authorities. We remain there as a temporary measure, providing emergency relief and the necessary operational space for the provinces to develop sustainable, provincially sourced solutions. While we continue to take all proper precautions including task-specific training and training on the proper use of personal protective equipment, the fact remains that our CAF members are operating in a high risk environment. Last week, the CAF confirmed 5 COVID cases among personnel deployed to long-term care facilities, with plans to update those numbers once every two weeks. However, as the number of cases increased, we felt that it was important to be transparent and provide more frequent updates. The CAF has now confirmed 29 cases total: 13 in Ontario, and 16 in Quebec. The increase in positive cases is due to a combination of factors, including receiving formal confirmation of a number of testing results we had been waiting on last week. Furthermore, as the incubation period of COVID-19 varies considerably from person to person, the showing of symptoms can take time. We will continue to update numbers daily, Monday to Friday, on the <u>CAF COVID response webpage</u>.

We remain deployed in northern and Indigenous communities. Across Canada, approximately 1,200 Canadian Rangers are deployed in the fight against COVID-19, conducting a variety of critical tasks based on community needs. As we mark Indigenous Awareness week in Canada, there is no better time to recognize the important work our Rangers are doing in support of these communities. And there is no better time to honour the legacy and contribution that Indigenous people have made in the Canadian Armed Forces.

And we are working diligently to refine and implement our plans for business resumption. Specifically, a number of critical force generation activities related to training, recruitment and administration will resume on a limited basis when it has been deemed safe and appropriate to do so. The Defence Team will resume these activities in a progressive, deliberate, and safe manner, in order to ensure the ongoing and future operational effectiveness of the CAF while protecting the health and safety of our personnel. As critical activities start to resume, the CDS has made it clear that CAF readiness must be maintained and CAF members must not relax on measures put in place by the CAF to maintain personnel health and wellbeing. All resumption plans will be made using an abundance of caution, taking into account direction provided by federal, provincial, territorial and municipal health authorities.

Finally, in non-Op LASER related activity, on Tuesday senior CAF leaders held a technical brief on the <u>Cyclone accident and recovery operation</u>, which will get underway next week. Due to the depth at which the wreckage can be found, we're turning to our allies in the U.S. Navy for their help with the use of a remotely-operated submersible. The operation will take as long as needed. We remain hopeful to recover as many of our fallen and as much of the machine as possible.


