

The Department of National Defence and Canadian Armed Forces update -- July 17

Colleagues and partners in defence,

Around the world we continue to witness horrific instances of racism and discrimination against Black people, Indigenous peoples, and people of colour. Unfortunately, Canada is not immune to this type of behaviour, and neither are our institutions, including the Canadian Armed Forces. And though the Minister, the Deputy Minister and the Chief of the Defence Staff have long made it clear, that racism, extremism, and hateful conduct are not tolerated in the CAF and at DND, incidents related to hate and racism *do* continue to occur in our organization. This type of behaviour undermines our organization's operational effectiveness. It is completely unacceptable, and is incompatible with the values and ethics we hold dear as Canadians and members of the Defence Team.

To reaffirm our stance, this week, the CAF released a new policy framework in the form of a Defence Administrative Order and Directive (DAOD) to address harassment, violence and discrimination, including hateful conduct, within our institution. We need to clearly define what constitutes hateful conduct, and for the first time this new DAOD does just that; providing a path forward to addressing unacceptable behaviour, with the ultimate goal of completely eliminating it from within our organization. I invite you to visit the Maple Leaf to read more about the policy framework, including further direction on how we are screening for, reporting, and moving toward ultimately eradicating hateful conduct in our ranks.

We are working hard to address these challenges, *and* towards fostering an inclusive culture based on trust, respect, and dignity for everyone. An inclusive culture empowers our people. It contributes to

team cohesiveness and morale. And ultimately, it enhances our capabilities as a force. The Royal Canadian Navy is taking an important step in this respect. Today, they opened up<u>consultations</u> with CAF members and the broader public, to rename the junior Non-Commissioned Member ranks (Ordinary Seaman, Able Seaman, Leading Seaman and Master Seaman) to non-gendered titles.

While we take critical steps now toward becoming a more diverse and fully inclusive force, it's important that we take the time to reflect upon and learn from our Canadian history. This past Saturday was the Black Culture Centre for Nova Scotia's annual remembrance day for the No.2 Construction Battalion — Canada's first and only all Black unit in the First World War. They overcame hurdles to serve their country, but their struggle did not end when they returned home. Despite their critical support to the war effort, they didn't receive the proper recognition and gratitude that they deserved. We will share their story, and learn from past mistakes.

On the business resumption front, this weekend, the future HMCS *Harry DeWolf* underwent sea trials in Halifax. These trials are part of ongoing verification work and will ensure that the <u>Arctic and Offshore Patrol Ship</u> and crew are ready to support Royal Canadian Navy operations. And on Monday, the Canadian Armed Forces proudly resumed their post at the <u>National War Memorial in Ottawa</u>. After being delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the National Sentry Program has resumed in a progressive, deliberate, and safe manner. It will continue at a reduced schedule until November 10th.

Finally, there have been a number of Senior Appointments and retirements in the CAF this week. Following a distinguished 31 year career in the Canadian Armed Forces, on Wednesday, Vice Chief of the Defence Staff, Lieutenant-General Jean-Marc Lanthier, retired from service. Lieutenant-General Mike Rouleau took over the VCDS post, having most recently served as the Commander of the Canadian Joint Operations Command (CJOC). Yesterday, Lieutenant-General Christine Whitecross completed her command of the NATO Defence College in Rome, and will retire from the Canadian Armed Forces in September. LGen Whitecross has been an incredible and inspiring leader throughout her career. And early next week, Lieutenant-General Alain Pelletier will take over from Lieutenant-General Chris Coates, as NORAD Deputy Commander, in Colorado Springs, as LGen Coates moves to Commander, CJOC. We wish him well in this new role. And we wish LGen Lanthier and LGen Whitecross well in their much deserved retirement.
