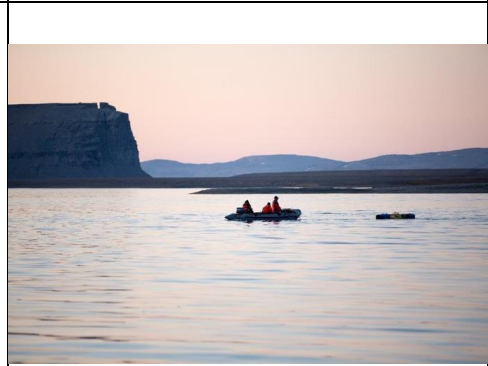

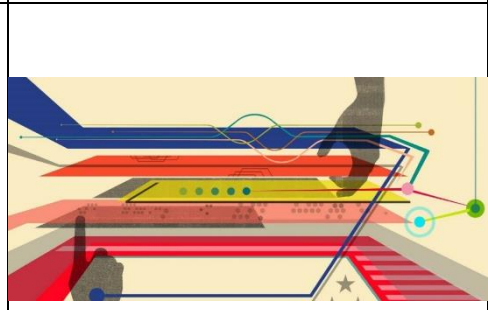

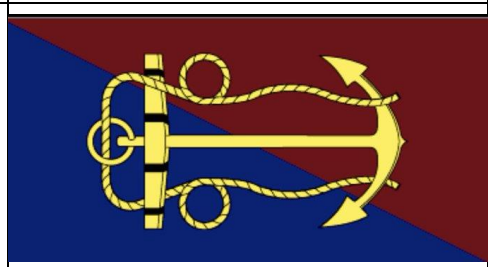

Some navies like the USN announce ship names early in the procurement process. Generally, Canada waits for a publicly appropriate time further along a project timeline before announcing the name of a warship (the announcement is not the same as a naming ceremony). Yes, the Government of Canada did announce early the two Queenston-class oilers of the Joint Support Ship project, but then the next Government changed the names. After all, a name is just a government decision announcement until a naming ceremony happens.

So, it may be a while yet before Canada announces the names of the ships (likely to be typed as frigates) of the Canadian Surface Combatant project. At least the name of the first-oc-class, which would also become the class name. Hopefully, like the USN with USS *Congress* and like other navies, ship names with lots of history and honour will be chosen. That is part of building united and strong ships' companies. After 110 years of Royal Canadian Navy, this country has many good names from which to select.

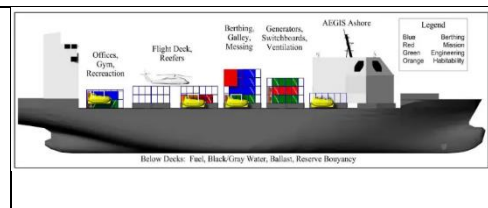

Hmm, "Aegis system and radar fitted aboard commercial/civilian merchant ships." Increasingly, sensor and weapon systems are being 'packaged' in containers and modules that can be fitted relatively easily aboard various vessels including non-warships. That is changing the nature of operations at sea, especially the capability of navies to mobilize many more vessels to undertake tasks at sea. Not just tactical tasks like submarine detection and local air warning, but operational and strategic levels such as regional air surveillance, ballistic missile defence and regional basing. Naval staffs, the operators, engineers and logisticians, need to study the possibilities. Civil organizations (ship owning companies, even private small vessel owners) need to be educated and brought into the planning.

Illegal, Unregulated and Unreported (IUU) "has been rated as the highest maritime security threat, more serious than piracy and narcotic smuggling ..."

Then there's the bit in the article that technology aboard Chinese fishing vessels is being used to map the sea bottom and objects thereon, very important information for anti-submarine operations. And "These trawlers can deploy hydrophones which can send alerts in near real-time to assist in naval activities." "And, these Chinese trawlers can comfortably carry weaponized underwater vehicles which are portable and trawler launched." [Hmm, new acronym (or translated differently) - Portable Underwater Vehicle (PUV).]

The Chinese research and fishing fleets need to be treated the same as is their Navy. Watched carefully, with responses measures ready.

The balance of defence budget funding between a state's navy, army and air force (and other services) should depend on national defence and security policy and concomitant strategies. Not on some proportional, 'fair,' cut. Policy is affected by, amongst other factors, a state's geo-strategic situation. If a state is relatively isolated from where it need/may need to be to affect activities in support of national objectives, then those forces that have geo-strategic mobility and are instrumental in 'getting there' should receive more attention.
