

"Bid by China's Tencent for Reddit provokes concerns about censorship" is a Taiwan News article that states that the



Chinese social media giant (and Chinese Communist Party social media censor) is planning on investing in Reddit, known for its open free-wheeling lack of censorship. It seems incongruous unless one takes a look at China's attempts to become partners with various media outlets then seeking to "charm" them into supporting a more pro-Chinese approach. This was also the theme of the Australian Broadcasting Corporation article "China's Multi-Million Dollar Media Campaign, 'A Major Threat to Democracies' Around the World" published 9 February 2019 and commented on by RUSI(NS).

There is considerable concern about Chinese efforts to curtail criticisms of their approach. The Chinese have tried to show the success of their system of "socialism with Chinese characteristics" as espoused by President Xi. It has been well received by anyone seeking to dominate their own country in the long term. In the liberal democracies, once they understand, there is more than a little horror. The question with this type of investment is what has to be given up? Will Reddit be forced to run Chinese rebuttals or "new facts" to see the "correct way?" These last pieces are infamous in Chinese media as the correct way is always China's approach as an example. The question always turns on the one real question, and it is always the same one: can China under the Communist Chinese Party be trusted? The answer unfortunately will always be the same, given China's actions and threats. The answer is an emphatic 'NO.'

Warship rejected by DND years ago will now be the backbone of Canada's future navy

The Alion proposal was interesting but would have resulted in two hull designs, amongst other issues. The Norwegian frigate HELGE INSTEAD was a Spanish F-100 design. It has been determined that there was a major engineering defect which prevented the ship from being water tight. In fact, the



propulsion shafts also let in water through the shafts, resulting ultimately in the loss of the ship after she was damaged in a collision with the tanker SOLA late last year.

In 2011, the Type 26 was just off the drawing board. It has been modified considerably since and is in

production in Britain. It has also been the choice of the Australians, thus there are a total of 32 units ordered. The British also wanted 13 but expenses cut the program to eight vessels. The cut was not the choice of the Royal Navy. The Type 31 is not their choice as replacement for the five cut units as that design is for export and is less capable. The main reason for the cut was the expense for Britain of new carriers and new ballistic missile submarines - it was not a problem with the design of the Type 26. The article does mention this point. It means three countries that work together may be able to develop a standardised program that means the ships could be repaired in Britain, Australia, and Canada, not to mention Britain's increasing base footprint in the Middle and Far East. There are many benefits to this reparability. In 2011, this was a major issue; it is not so now.

Strong, Secure, Engaged: Canada's Defence Policy

There is certainly activity in the movement forward on the implementation of Strong, Secure, Engaged. The Royal Canadian Navy has benefited but the Royal Canadian Air Force and Canadian Army have not moved as fast. The pending retirement of the CC130H aircraft leaves a gap in air-t-air refuelling. The CP140 Aurora patrol aircraft replacement project needs a start soon if the aircraft are to be replaced by 2030. The CH146 helicopter austere modernization seems misplaced effort as that chopper is not really fire support vehicle.

The Army has started receiving new trucks and the Tactical Armoured Patrol Vehicle but has no air defence capability beyond the 50 calibre heavy machine gun, and there are not very many 155mm field guns. The M113 armoured personnel carrier (APC), although rebuilt, should be replaced by a modern tracked APC. The lists go on and on!

The Army Reserve is having recruiting and retention challenges, as always.

One cannot see how we can be combat ready if Putin or Xi make a move or Israel comes under attack and Trump decides the US Armed Forces are not going to participate in another foreign war.

So the "global game of Go," with nations strategically locating

bases, continues. Did it ever really go away? Reading Hector Bywater's "Navies and Nations" it is evident that the availability of bases had a tremendous influence on strategic possibilities at the inter-World War period of his writings. The Chinese are demonstrating that it still does. Good to see the democratic states (hmm, shades of Singapore in recent UK considerations) realize, even if tardy, the importance of this 'game.'

The fact that the Royal Navy (RN) never completely left Singapore is an example of keeping some part of a foot in the Indo-Pacific region. Naval Party 1022 runs a refueling and supply operation at Singapore for the RN and allies. The Royal Australian Navy and United States Navy are looking at re-establishing naval and air facilities at Manus Island in Papua New Guinea. There are other locations apparently under early consideration. It appears that the Royal Canadian Navy-leased Motor Vessel ASTERIX has become something of a Far Eastern mobile base for Canada. Things are getting interesting in that part of the globe.

A Chinese View of the U of T Election of a Tibetan Student Leader as President

"China slams Canadian Media 'Hype' on Student Patriotic Actions" (http://www.globaltimes.cn/content/1139052.shtml) is a Global Times article. Canada never gets mentioned in the Chinese press of late unless it China is criticizing Canada's "lack of understanding and failure to have the correct view" from China's. point of view, which is to say we should agree with China always.



The University of Toronto (U of T) elected Chemi Lhamo as the new President of the U of T Scarborough Campus. Since then she has been subject of a series of vicious attacks on social media by apparently mainly Han Chinese students. Ms Lhamo is a proud Tibetan and shows her love of her own country openly, however, this has drawn the ire of certain members of the Chinese community. The Chinese consulate and embassy have failed to condemn the attacks and say it is a matter of freedom of speech. The embassy commented that it is merely students expressing their opinion on "factual errors," etc., regarding Tibetan and Xinjiang separatists. It is interesting that China (read Communist Chinese Party - CCP) uses the use of free speech to justify an attack on a free and fair election by Canadian students in Canada. What can one say?

Well, Australia has gone through this experience and continues to act against CCP influence in the electoral process and in Australia's daily life. Professor Clive Hamilton describes this untoward influence in his book "The Silent Invasion: How China is Turning Australia into a Puppet State." Action is being taken to avoid the CCP's influence both by legislation and by closer scrutiny of allegedly benign Chinese social groups. It can be said that some of his findings seem to be "over the top" but, somewhat horrifyingly, they now appear to be so after investigations by Australian authorities.

Jonathan Manthorpe has written a book "The Claws of the Panda: Beijing's Campaign of Influence and Intimidation in Canada," providing a Canadian perspective on the issue. China is essentially "attacking" many Western democracies through their own system. Mr Manthorpe also states that Canada has been naive about our relationship with China including having a false narrative of China that is benign. At the end he calls for a reinvention of the narrative and a more clear-eyed view of what is truly an adversary. He does not state we should cut off ties but rather be clearer about the real threat that China (read, CCP) actually poses through a variety of methods whether student groups, Chinese language media ownership, political donations, etc. It is an interesting and thoughtful read especially after one views the reaction to the election of Ms Lhamo. It makes one wonder what will happen if Canada rejects Huawei for any 5G infrastructure. Keep in mind that China will also use "useful dupes" to gain their way, such as found at the CBC website: "Possible Ban of Huawei Over National Security Could Delay 5G Rollout Telus Says" (https://www.cbc.ca/news/business/telus-huawei-earnings-1.5019946).

Telus and other Canadian telecoms have used Huawei equipment in their 3G and 4G networks, and the equipment is still there. Huawei has been partnering with these telecoms to the tune of about 1.5B Cdn dollars. The telecoms are not responsible for national security, the Government of Canada is. Our government has been less than lax about national security issues and has not put in the necessary capabilities or resources to judge at this point. There has been more effort of oversight than providing the necessary tools to ensure the safety and security of our national infrastructure. So why is 5G different? The whole structure has to be 5G. It is based on the creation of the internet of things from your refrigerator to home security. Thus having a company that is capable of being controlled by an adversary is not a really good idea.

The issue is always the same: can we trust the CCP? Certainly not, based on their actions on Ms Meng, ownership of the Chinese language press and the reaction to the election of a student president amongst other

things. The answer continues to be an emphatic 'NO.'

So It Begins?

'China is your Daddy:' Backlash Against Tibetan Student's Election Prompts Questions About Foreign Influence

This is a CBC news article that reads to similar Australian incidents. It is really the first time that has been seen in mainstream Canadian media about pro-Chinese influencers in the Canadian context.

Canada's profile in China has increased and not in a good way. China's government has used 'trolls' to provide plausible deniability to the government and a useful way to conduct information warfare to pressure adversaries, in this case alleged Tibetan separatists. As mentioned in recent discussions, up to 80% of the Canadian Chinese-language press is financed at least in part by the Chinese government. Canada has become a target for China. The pressure is increasing to allow Huawei and other Chinese tech firms into Canada's communications infrastructure. It will be interesting to see if this type of activity will increase in the next while as a result of the higher profile caused by the arrest of Ms Meng, the CFO of Huawei. Is this action against a student leader a sign of pressure to come throughout Canadian society?

A Lesson for Canada

This is a South China Morning Post article. It is a lesson in how not to do things, and the British have certainly done a marvellous job not doing it right. The article makes it quite clear that Britain has "sold" itself to the Chinese, including nuclear power and even the



ability to devise its own foreign policy because of the massive damage China can do by economic means.

One has to wonder whether Britain's decision to allow Huawei in British communications systems is made for legitimate reasons or by political pressure to not anger the Chinese during the disastrous Brexit move that will satisfy no one in Britain or in Europe. It is also more than likely that Britain will end up with a hard Brexit with little or no hope of an immediate fix, which will also have dire consequences economically for Britain. Quite simply, Britain now cannot afford to anger the Chinese. The bottom line is that Britain has made itself the weakest sister in the "Five-Eyes" community. Its communications can no longer be considered safe.

The closest equivalent would be for Britain to have bought their radar from Nazi Germany for home defence prior to the Second World War. China is an adversary the likes that has not been seen in modern times. It is nothing more than a criminal state doing as it chooses to lesser states. Britain has made itself very vulnerable to the actions of China. The worst part of this issue is that it is completely self-inflicted.

A False Argument

Banning Huawei from Canada's 5G networks could be costly for taxpayers

The reason that Huawei is where it is, is that allegedly they stole technology. Allowing its equipment into the Canadian communications infrastructure in 3G and 4G systems was based on China continuing to improve its overall record in human rights, openness, rule of law, etc. Companies with nothing on their mind but profit are not responsible for Canadian security. The Canadian government is and this is becoming very clear that the Chinese government (read Communist Chinese Party - CCP) is hurtling back to the 1960s and Mao's excesses through the new "core leader" in the form of President Xi. The current concentration camps of the Uyghur minority in Xinjiang Province, also known as occupied East Turkestan, is an excellent indicator of CCP actions now and in future. East Turkistan was invaded by Red Chinese forces in June 1950, and has been occupied and colonized by Han Chinese ever since. The Han Chinese colonizers have not been able to eliminate the separatist movement. As a result, Xinjiang province is heavily occupied by large numbers of Chinese security troops. Does Canada want to condone, by weak or non-existent action, cultural genocide?

The recent crackdown on Christian, Muslim and other religious faiths also should dampen any consideration of further upgrades to the Canada-China relationship. The CCP views the rise of religion as a major threat to the survival of the CCP government, with religious affiliation far exceeding that of the CCP in numbers. They crackdown on religious freedom, and human rights advocates and persons who advocate a multi-party system are systematically attacked and imprisoned. What chance would Mr Ren have if he denied the Chinese intelligence services access to Huawei systems? The answer is, he would be imprisoned and the Chinese intelligence services would have their way.

Huawei should be banned. If China does go down the road of legal action, we should take our lumps and do what we have to do to make it right. Making it right also means getting rid of the treaty as soon as possible. China under the current leadership cannot be trusted. Any treaty made with them is subject to their whims as we have seen with the basic law implementation in Hong Kong, which this year starts the elimination of the democratic process there. Canada remains silent as rights are removed despite the evidence that action is being taken against the people of Hong Kong.

As stated before, the ultimate question is not about Huawei itself and the utility of its equipment. The real question continues to be, and it is the only question really, can we trust the current CCP government? The answer is 'no.' Huawei cannot do a thing to stop the CCP's "requests" - Huawei must comply. As shown, China is not a trusted partner and has consistently shown a total lack of ethical and moral conduct. Cost should never be a consideration. Allowing a mistake to continue would be even a greater problem.

Wow, that is reassuring. It is well known how China's laws function - they are at the whim of the Communist Chinese Party (CCP).




