THERE'S AN UNPREDICTABLE HOMBRE LOOSEIN THE MIDDLE EAST



Nanaimo, 21 July 2018...Turkey, a program partner in the development

of the US F 35 (pair shown opposite), has ordered 116 of that stealth fighter aircraft. The first of these has now rolled off the basic production line in the States, and, with software and dodads added, will presumably be ready for delivery to the Turks next year or by early 2020 at the latest.

Coincidentally, 2020 is also when Turkey will take delivery of the Russian-provided & Russian bankrolled S -400 Triumph (Триумф) Surface-to-Air Mid & Long-Range Missile SysUSINNI Page 2

tem. What isn't clear is against just whose aircraft the S-400 is intended; Israel; Greece?

Members will, I hope, recall my prediction two years back that Turkey will almost certainly have left or have been booted from NATO within five years, ie, by the end of 2021. That's still my view. However, should Donald Trump still be President then, anything, but anything, is possible!

An Israeli think-tank has been moni-

toring the strained & ambiguous relations NATO has with Turkey. These relationships are made more awkward by longstanding Turkish resentment at being treated as "second class" by the European Union, which includes many NATO partners. One BESA paper (published in Israel). authored by Burak Bekdil, formerly an Ankara-based columnist, outlines Israeli reasoning on why Turkey is neither a reliable NATO partner nor a trustworthy regional ally for anyone. According to Bekdil's report, "... Turkey and Syria held a joint military exercise in April 2009 – the first of its kind between a NATO member and a Russian-armed and trained client state. In September 2010, Turkish and Chinese aircraft conducted joint exercises in Turkish airspace. This, too, was a first for a NATO member. In 2011, before finally

cion for systematically and clandestinely abetting various jihadist groups in Syria, including ISIS. The Turks were believed to have included logistics and arms. While the West's primary goal was to fight ISIS, Erdogan has sought to topple Syria's Alawite President Bashar Assad and install a Sunni, pro-Turkey, Islamist regime in his place..."

Of course, I can't attest to the full accuracy of Bekdil's report, but it rings true for me. More critically, over the past two years, the Turks have attacked Kurdish & Arab forces in Syria and Iraq, forces that right then were allied with and cooperating in Alliance (NATO) military actions against Sunni Islamic terrorist forces (ITGIS). Turkey has, on a number of occasions, also actually dangerously interfered with & obstructed US, German and other NATO missions conducted on the ground in or the skies over Syria, some of those NATO missions launched from Turkish bases hosting NATO forces. In the past year or 18 months, Turkey's relations with Russia and Iran now better than likerelations with Turkey's NATO partners.

Increasingly radically Sunni Salafist-bent with President Erdogan at the helm, Turkey has become part of the problem for us all in the Middle East. Most who have given it any thought at all, no longer consider Turkey to be a fully-fledged democracy, citing: the lack of free & fair elections; the endemic purges & jailing of opponents; curtailed press freedom; and, Erdogan's


